At Yeshiva Tiferet we teach more than laws; we teach Torah that is all encompassing. It speaks to our intellect and nourishes our emotions. It instructs us how to act, and requires us to confront ourselves. It shows us who we can be, and it provokes us to appreciate the richness of life and creation.

Your guide on this quest for knowledge of self and Torah is your rebbe. He will help you identify your challenges and overcome them, so that you can discover your abilities and interests and develop your full potential. And his open home and heart will breathe life into all that you learn.

The intense learning is balanced by extensive programming: melavei malka, kumsitzes, monthly tiyulim, and shabbatonim in various communities to experience the diversity of Am Yisrael b'Eretz Yisrael. All these activities lead to a focused yet relaxed atmosphere, where the mature student can excel.

**Morning Seder 9:30-1:00**

Gemara B'Iyun: Targeted towards development of textual and analytical skills, this seder is divided between preparation for the shiur, and the shiur itself. Monitored by the maggid shiur with pertinent source texts provided, you will tackle the evolution of the sugya from the Gemara to the Rishonim to the analysis of the classic Lithuanian thinkers. The vigorously interactive shiurim, in which you defend your own conclusions while challenging the conclusions of your friends and maggid shiur, teach you to distinguish nuances and articulate different approaches to the sugya.

**Afternoon Seder 2:45-5:30**

As you reach adulthood, you face many new issues, e.g., emunah, the reasons behind mitzvot, and, of course, living as a committed Jew in a secular world. To prepare you for this stage, most afternoon shiurim focus on hashkafa topics.





Choose between shiurim on Chumash, Mishna, Nach, Halacha, Tefillah, and Jewish Philosophy (e.g., Rambam, Maharal, Ramchal, Gra, R. Zadok HaKohen et al).

### **Night Seder 8:00-10:00**

In contrast to the first seder focus on analysis, the night seder, Gemara Bekiut, provides breadth of knowledge and a quantifiable sense of accomplishment. The seder is divided between shiur and independent study (monitored by the maggid shiur) with systematic reviews and quizzes. Boys have had extraordinary success in this program with many of them completing the mesechet in the course of the year.

### **Chazzarah Club 10:20-11:00**

Optional seder focused on *mastering* the mesechet in its entirety. Other students choose between personal learning projects and shiurim. The various recreational facilities are also available at this time and during breaks.

The Yeshiva is located on the magnificent 18-acre campus of Kiryat Noar, in Bayit V'Gan, Jerusalem.

Dormitory facilities include spacious, carpeted, split-level rooms with separate work and living areas. The dormitories are open continuously throughout the year.

On campus there is an indoor gym, fully equipped weight room, ping-pong room, and several floodlit outdoor basketball courts.

Breakfast, lunch, and dinner are served daily in the Yeshiva dining room.

Private e-mail accounts are available for every student.





## Ma'alot Tiferet מעלות תפארת

A unique and astounding facet of the Yeshiva is Maalot Tiferet. Maalot Tiferet courses are recognized by ACE (American Council on Education). Depending on one's area of concentration, Thomas Edison State College of New Jersey accepts ACE courses in Jewish Studies for up to 90 of the 120 credits needed for a bachelor's degree. The 30 remaining credits may be earned through courses at any accredited university, CLEP tests, and AP courses.

Advantages of Maalot Tiferet are:

- While learning in Yeshiva shiurim and sedarim you progress rapidly towards your degree.
- Motivated students have attained a bachelor's degree inexpensively and quickly – often within two years.
- Maalot graduates have continued their education in top ranked graduate programs including Columbia, Yale, Penn State, and NYU.
